Assemblies had a reading theme, looking at pupil's (and Mr Scruton's!) reading journey, poetry as part of World Poetry Day as well as celebrating National Shakespeare Week.

Parents/carers were invited into school for tours with Mr Scruton and Mrs Dorn to find out more about how reading (and writing) are taught in school and had the opportunity to visit classrooms to see the teaching of reading and writing 'live'. In Shakespeare week, pupils found out more about this notable figure in our country's literacy history in assembly and back in classrooms experienced some Shakespearean language through studying some of his most famous works. For World Book Day children were invited to create/make a clue from their favorite story with the winners all getting to choose a fabulous new book to keep from our Book Fair. There were some truly amazing entries which are now on display in the school reception. Well done to the winners!
