## Collecting Pupils at the End of the School Day

It is great to have a wider range of after-school clubs on offer for pupils however can I remind parents to have clear plans in place to collect your son or daughter at the end of after-school clubs. Staff or outside providers running our after-school clubs will often have work or family commitments, therefore they are unable to wait much beyond the expected time of collection. We have recently had instances of children being collected late, (very late in some cases) and staff or club providers having to ring parents or wait for unreasonably long periods of time for children to be collected. Please note, that our STARS after school club is open until 6pm and children can use this service after school or after attending an in-school club (£10.50 per session). Please contact the office to check for availability or to book. To ensure pupil safety, we may send pupils at the end of after-school clubs into S.T.A.R.S and therefore have to charge parents for this service, if children are not collected on time or if permission isn't given for older children to walk home.

#### Year 6 SATS

Our Y6 pupils were subject to the 'dreaded' SATs earlier this term (you may have caught some news stories of how difficult the reading test was!) The children were excellent, showing real resilience in what is a very challenging week for everyone in school. The wonderful support the children have had from our Y6 team in preparing this moment was a notable contributor to their readiness. Well done to all our children in Y6 and to all those adults who have supported the children at this challenging time.
