Behaviour

As part of our school improvement work this year we will be focusing on behaviour. We know that the vast majority of pupils behave well and are very much in-tune with our expectations. Parents/carers also believe this to be the case (95% parents/carers agree/strongly agree that school ensures its pupils are well behaved- 2022 questionnaire.)

Our main focus, will be looking at ways at in which we can reward pupils for high standards of behavior; however, to get to this stage we are beginning by refreshing our expectations. Parents will have received a ParentMail today detailing the new behaviour expectations that we will be trialing this half term currently titled our 'Take Care Rules'. These have been shared with pupils this week in assembly and we will begin this trial beginning 7/11/22 until Christmas. Please take some time to discuss these with your son or daughter.

Uniform

A reminder that pupils must be in the correct uniform at all times-details can be found on the school website. Trainers are not school uniform-please ensure your son or daughter is in shoes unless it is a P.E day. I will be focusing on pupils wearing jewellery and nail varnish this half term. Please note, our school uniform standard states that stud earrings are acceptable, however other jewellery and nail varnish must not be worn in school. Thank you in advance for your support.
